


It is my hope that your attendance at this WASBE Conference will leave you enriched and fulfilled, and that you will share your experiences from this week with our colleagues and musicians at home.







### KEYNOTE SPEAKER



#### FREDERICK FENNELL

was born in 1914, started his musical training at childhood and studied conducting under Hardings. At 25 years of age he served with distinction as a conductor at Eastman School of Music and established the Eastman Wind Ensemble in 1952. Dr. Fennell joined the Minneapolis Symphony as Associate Music Director and from 1965 he conducted the University of Miami's Symphony Orchestra and Wind Ensemble and has maintained the role of Honorary Conductor since 1980.

In 1984 Dr. Fennell became the Principal Conductor of the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra of Japan. Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra received the first Japan Symphonic Musical Academy Award under his direction in 1991.

Among his many honors, Dr. Fennell received the University of Rochester's Honorary Doctorate in Music, the Honor Medal of Interlochen, the American Award of Merit for Musical Education, and recognition from the John Philip Sousa Society in 1985. In 1994, following Leonard Bernstein, he was the seventh person to win the Theodore Thomas Award. In Kofu, Japan, a concert hall bears his name with recognition to Fennell as one of the leading and most influential conductors of modern times.

"Bio-Discography, Fortissio," a book written by Roger Rickson in 1993 and published by Ludwig Music, Inc., covers the past 40 years of the Fennell story.

Recognized and honored by his colleagues as their Conductor Laureate, his association with wind orchestras continues.

# PROFILES OF PRESENTERS



Erwin (Bud) Beyer received his B.S. from Northwestern University and has studied acting with Alvina Krause and mime with Etienne DeCroux. He is

the founder and former director of the Northwestern University Mime Company. A member of SAG, AEA, and AFTRA, Mr. Beyer has professional credits that include work as an actor, director, and manager. Mr. Beyer has taught intensive scene study summer workshops for professional actors in both New York and Los Angeles. During the past ten years, Mr. Beyer has been presenting lectures and workshops on gesture and movement for orchestral and band conductors throughout the country. Prior to joining Northwestern University in 1972, Mr. Beyer held positions as Artist in Residence at Loyola University, Head of the Theatre School at St. Albans' Repertory in Washington, and Coordinator of the Drama Department for Operation Area Arts, Green Bay, WI. He has conducted workshops in mime and acting for colleges, universities and festivals across the United States and published, with Charlotte Lee, "Speaking of Theatre," Scott Foresman and Company (1974). He was also featured in "The New Generation of Acting Teachers" written by Eva Meckler (1988).

James Cochran holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees in clarinet and wind conducting from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville and has held wind conducting positions at Southern Illinois University, Edwardsville and University of Missouri, St. Louis.



In his position at Shattinger Music, he oversees all aspects of the instrumental music department. In 1993 he founded and published the first edition of

Resource, a newsletter for the creative wind conductor. Every year since 1994 he has been clinician and lecturer at the Art of the Wind Band Symposium held at the University of Minnesota. In October 1995, at the invitation of Timothy Reynish, Mr. Cochran presented a repertoire session at the BASBWE conference in Manchester, England. He has also conducted repertoire sessions for CBDNA regional conventions across the country.

Recently, he established the Cochran commissioning group, which will be an annual commission seeking to add to the wind chamber repertoire. Shattinger Music and five schools commissioned Clark McAlister to write this year's work. The work is

scored for 16 winds and is entitled *Woodscapes*. It was premiered by the commissioning schools in April of 1999 and will be published this fall.

James Croft, Professor of Music and Director of Bands at Florida State University received his BME from Cornell College, an MA from Northern Iowa University and his doctorate from the University of Oklahoma.

He has presented workshops and clinics at a number of colleges and universities throughout the country. Widely sought as a guest conductor, lecturer, adjudicator and clinician, he has acted in these capacities in 44 states, and Europe, Mexico, Canada, Israel and Australia.



In 1972 he joined the faculty of the University of South Florida as Director of Bands, remaining there until assuming his present position as

Professor of Music and Director of Bands at the Florida State University in 1980. He is a past president of both the National Band Association and College Band Directors National Association and the Atlantic Coast Conference Band Directors Association. He also serves as a Contributing Editor for *The Instrumentalist* and as Consulting Editor for *The Quarterly*. He is currently an elected member of the WASBE Board of Directors. Both Cornell College and the University of Oklahoma have recognized him as a distinguished alumnus. In 1997 he was selected for a University Teaching Award and recognized as the University Educator of the year.

Dr. Garofalo has authored nine books and numerous music publications. His articles, both scholarly and practical, have appeared in national and international music journals and dictionaries. He maintains an active



where he has been on the faculty since 1960. He is the first recipient of both the Senior Researcher Award granted by the Music Educators National Conference and the Award of Merit, the National Association for Music Therapy's highest recognition. His varied background includes experience as a professional trumpeter; Director of Bands, Helper City Schools, Utah; and Acting Director of the Marching and Concert Bands at Brigham Young University. At Florida State University he has taught applied brass, been Director of the Brass Choir and Associate Director of the Marching Chiefs. He presently teaches Psychology of Music and advanced courses in experimental design and evaluation and is Coordinator of Music Education, Music Therapy and Contemporary Media. Larry Rachleff is in his eighth season as Professor of Conducting and Music Director of Rice University's Shepherd School Orchestras. This fall, he begins his

third year as Music Director of The Rhode Island Philharmonic, and seventh season as Music Director of Chicago's Symphony II (formerly Orchestra of Illinois), an orchestra comprised of members of the Lyric Opera of Chicago Orchestra. Previously, Mr. Rachleff was on the faculty of the Oberlin Conservatory where he served as Music Director of Orchestras and Conductor of the Contemporary Ensemble, and at the University of Southern California where he was also Conductor of The Opera Theater. In addition, he has recorded for Bridge, Opus One, and Koch International.

In 1993, he received the unique honor of being chosen as one of four American conductors to lead the Cleveland Orchestra at Carnegie Hall under Maestro Pierre Boulez. He has appeared as guest conductor at Tanglewood, Aspen, the National Camp at Interlochen, and the Breckenridge Orchestra. He has conducted All-State festivals and orchestras in virtually every state in the U.S., as well as in Europe and Canada, and he has held week-long conducting residencies at leading universities and music schools. He has served as conducting clinician at workshops for the American Symphony Orchestra League and Conductors' Guild.



Timothy Reynish is Head of the School of Wind and percussion at the Royal Northern College of Music (RNCM), and artistic director

and conductor of the Wind Orchestra and its tour to Japan. He studied horn with Aubrey Brain and Frank Probyn and was a music scholar at Cambridge, working under Raymond Leppard and Sir David Willcocks, and held principal horn positions with Northern Sinfonia, Sadlers Wells Opera (now ENO) and the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra before taking up the post of Tutor in the Postgraduate Conducting Course at the RNCM in 1975. In 1977, he succeeded Philip Jones as Head of the School of Wind and Percussion.

In 1981, Reynish helped Frank
Battisti host the first international
wind band conference at the RNCM.
A founding member of both the
British Association for Symphonic
Bands and Wind Ensembles (BASBWE), he hosted the WASBE
Conference at the RNCM in 1991,
and the BASBWE Conferences in
1983, 1984, 1987, 1989, and 1993.
Reynish has guest conducted wind
orchestras in Germany, Hungary,
Israel, Scandinavia, and the USA and
for ten years has been Editor of the
Novello Wind Band Ensemble series.

Toshiyuki Shimada was named Music Director and Conductor of the Portland Symphony Orchestra in April, 1986, and began his thirteenth season with the orchestra in July, 1998. He was Conducting Associate of the Houston Symphony Orchestra for two years beginning in 1985, and was assistant conductor of the HSO for four years beginning in 1981.



He was Music Director of the Nassau Symphony Orchestra, Music Director of the Cambiata Soloists, a contemporary music ensemble in

Houston, Music Director of the Shepherd School Symphony Orchestra at Rice University during the 1982-83 season, and Music Director of the Young Musicians Foundation Debut Orchestra in Los Angeles from 1978-81.

He attended California State
University at Northridge, where he
earned degrees in conducting and
clarinet in 1977 and studied conducting with Lawrence Christianson. He

Musik in Vienna, and was a finalist
